

The Regional Streetlight Procurement Program (RSLPP) was a turnkey program that guided municipalities through the entire process of converting to an LED streetlight system and removed key barriers at every step.

By working cooperatively through the RSLPP, municipalities realized lower costs, benefited from shared technical expertise, and overcame procurement and contracting barriers to confidently navigate an LED streetlight conversion project. The RSLPP was designed to empower municipal staff to take control of energy efficiency upgrades that saved them thousands of dollars in energy costs annually. The RSLPP lasted five rounds, starting in 2015 and ending in 2025.



77 municipalities in SE Pennsylvania converted 47,859 streetlights and 12,451 traffic signals to LEDs.
