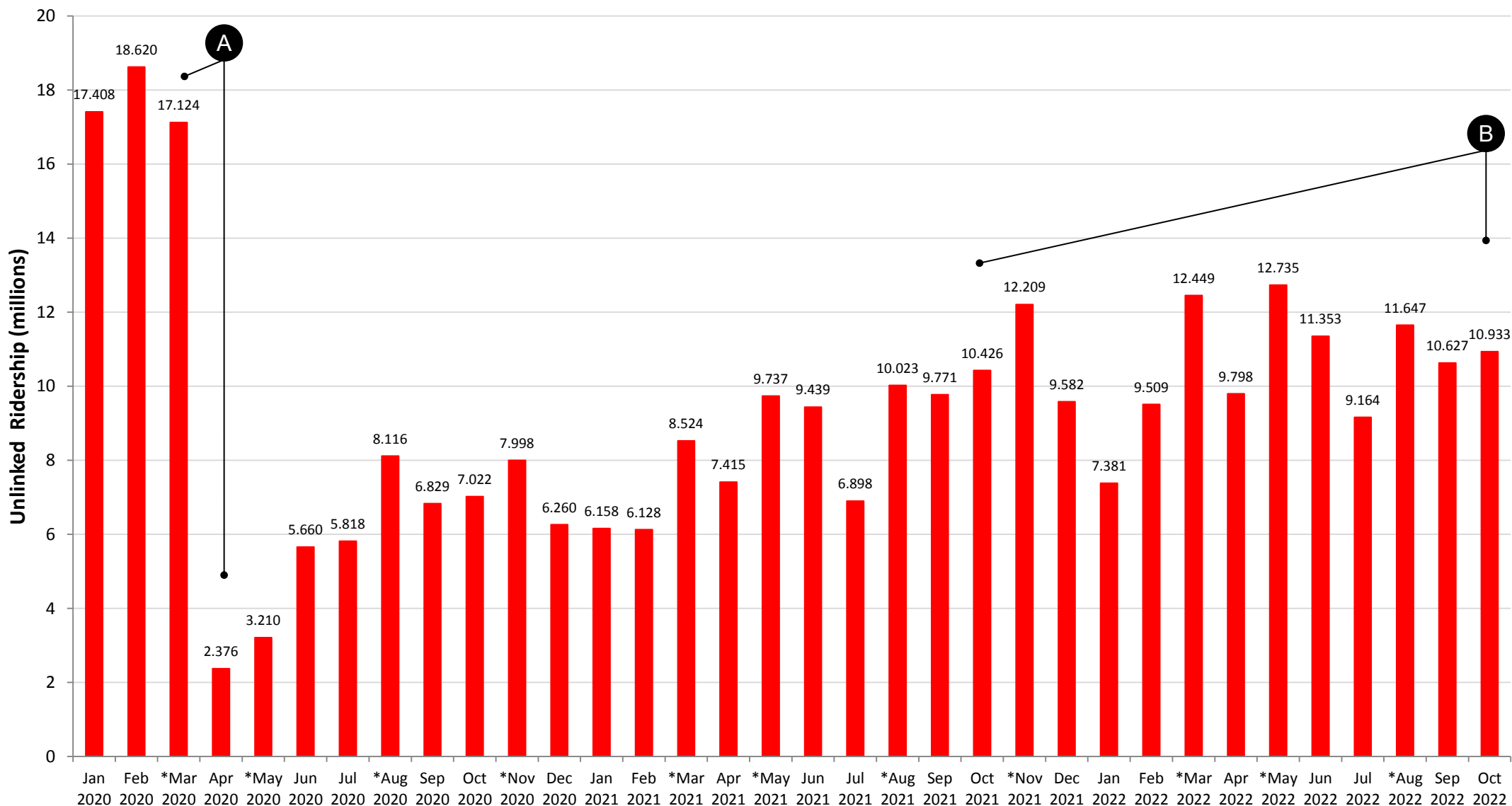


SEPTA Unlinked City Ridership from January 2020 to October 2022

A Comparing Mar 2020 to Apr 2020, City ridership dropped 86%, from 17.1 to 2.4 million.

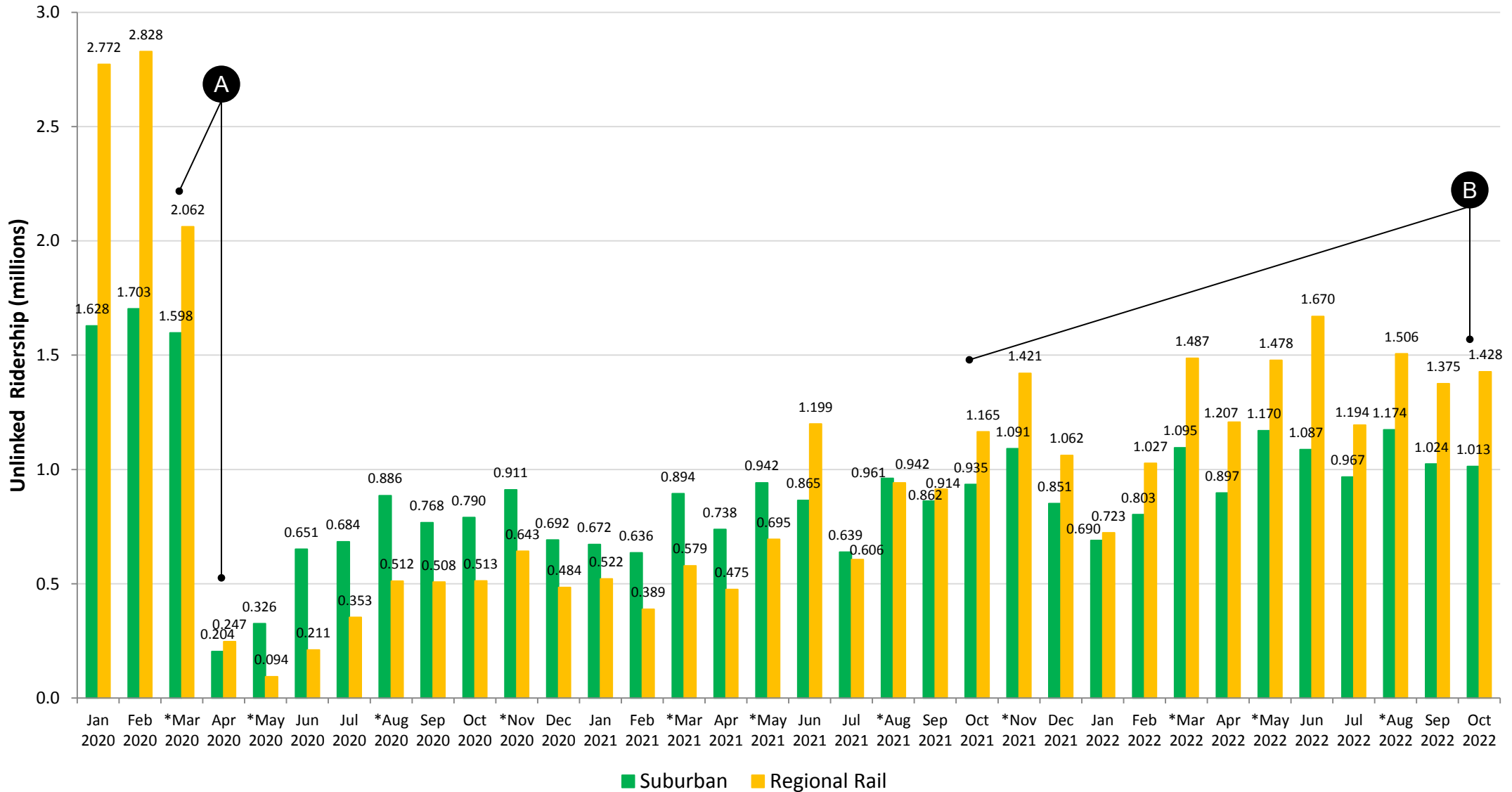
B City ridership increased 4.9% comparing Oct 2021 to Oct 2022, and is still well below pre-COVID levels.



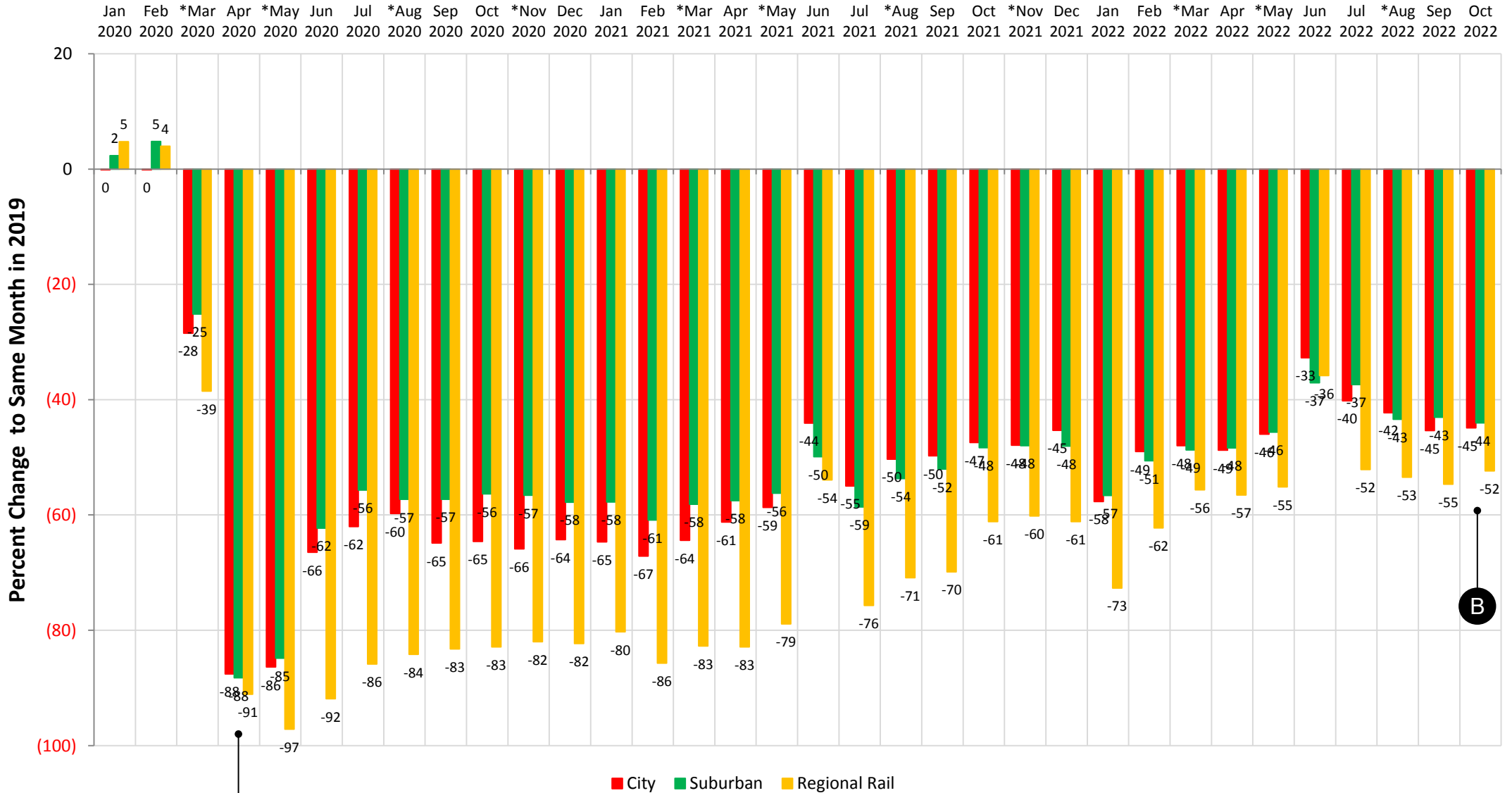
SEPTA Unlinked Suburban and Regional Rail Ridership from January 2020 to October 2022

A Comparing Mar 2020 to Apr 2020, Suburban and Regional Rail ridership dropped 87% and 88%, respectively.

B Suburban and Regional Rail ridership increased 8.3% and 22.6%, respectively, comparing Oct 2021 to Oct 2022, but still well below pre-COVID levels.



SEPTA Percent Change in Ridership Compared to 2019 Baseline



A Significant drop in ridership in Apr 2020 for all transit types with City and Suburban down by 88%, and Regional Rail down by 91%.

B City, Suburban and Regional Rail ridership down by 45%, 44% and 52%, respectively compared to the same months in 2019, and pre-COVID conditions.
